Aminata Ipyana is the oldest daughter of Colonel James H. Greene, DDS, and Mrs. Justine R. Greene, BASW. Ms. Ipyana is a graduate of Howard University and received her Juris Doctorate at Washington University School of Law. A dedicated public servant with over two decades of practice experience she has devoted her career to advocacy for and representation of indigent clients. As a solo practitioner she currently litigates matters in the Criminal and Family Divisions of the District of Columbia Superior Court. From 2001- 2005 she was an Associate Professor at Howard University School of Law(HUSL) teaching Criminal Law, Death Penalty legal writing seminar, and was a Supervising Attorney of the Criminal Justice Clinic. She has presented at legal academic conferences and attorney training sessions, and traveled to Cuba as a Faculty Advisor for an educational exchange program. Prior to her appointment to the faculty of HUSL she was a Staff Attorney at the Public Defender Service (PDS) for the District of Columbia serving in the Trial and Appellate Divisions, including the Youthful Offender Project representing juveniles charged as adults and clients under the age of twenty-four. Ms. Ipyana has litigated serious felony trial matters including narcotics, firearms, sexual assaults and homicides. She also serves the District of Columbia community through We Feed Our People, which annually serves food and clothing to the homeless and indigent in honor of the Martin Luther King, Jr. Holiday, and as a youth mentor with the Law and Government Explorers' Program.
