

## **Biographical Summary for Julie R. Breslow**

Julie Breslow is a Magistrate Judge in the Superior Court of the District of Columbia, where she has served in the Family Court since her appointment in 2002. She presides over child neglect cases and other family court cases including adoptions, guardianships, juvenile delinquency matters and domestic relations cases. Magistrate Judge Breslow presides over all neglect matters involving unaccompanied refugee minors in D.C. foster care. She is an Adjunct Professor at the Georgetown University Law Center where she teaches Child Welfare Law and Practice in the District of Columbia.

Before her appointment to the Superior Court, Magistrate Judge Breslow served as the Chief of the Victim Witness Assistance Unit for the U.S. Attorney's Office for the District of Columbia, the Victims' Rights Attorney for the U.S. Department of Justice's Executive Office of U.S. Attorneys, and the Director of the Court Services Unit for the Office of the General Receiver, D.C. Child and Family Services Agency. She spent five years as a trial attorney at the District of Columbia Office of the Corporation Counsel in the child abuse and neglect section, the juvenile delinquency section, and the child support enforcement section.

Magistrate Judge Breslow graduated *magna cum laude* from Union College and received her law degree from Albany Law School in 1989.
