

HON. PAUL B. HANDY is a Principal Administrative Law Judge (PALJ) for the D.C Office of Administrative Hearings, serving the office as PALJ in two subject areas; Licensing and Enforcement; and the Department of Public Works. He has served as an ALJ for D.C. OAH since shortly after the agency was founded in 2004, and was an ALJ in Maryland for six years prior to that. Judge Handy is a former Assistant Public Defender and sole practitioner, with extensive criminal and civil law litigation experience. He has been named attorney of the year for two divisions of the Maryland Office of the Public Defender, and was a Finalist for the 2011 Cafritz Awards for Outstanding Public Service to the D.C. community. Judge Handy is also an award-winning playwright, whose plays about social justice have been performed many times in theatres, bar association events, student scholarship fundraisers, and charitable events. His play, "Cry for the Gods," was performed at Congress, sponsored by the Hawaiian delegation to Congress in 2011. Judge Handy received a Bachelor of Arts from Rutgers University, with a double major in Labor Studies and Sociology, and a Juris Doctor from the University of Baltimore School of Law. He is married to Francisca Recio, an attorney with the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, and they have four-year-old twins, Marisa and Daniel.
