

BIOGRAPHICAL SUMMARY

Lloyd Urban Nolan, Jr., is a Magistrate Judge on the Superior Court of the District of Columbia. He was appointed by Chief Judge Lee F. Satterfield in 2010. Since his appointment in 2010, he has served in the Family Court Division. There Judge Nolan presided over family and certain criminal and civil hearings and non-jury trials. Judge Nolan has also served on several court committees.

In 1998, Judge Nolan received his Juris Doctorate from the George Washington University School of Law. While in law school, Judge Nolan was a member of the Faculty Tenure and Promotions Committee, and participated in the D.C. Law Students in Court program. He received the 1998 Patricia Roberts Harris Award, the Black Law Students Association's "Student of the Year" award, and the Shapiro Public Service Internship Award. Judge Nolan was also selected as the Black Law Students Association's Alumni of the year 2011

After law school, Judge Nolan served as a judicial law clerk for the Honorable Russell F. Canan of the D.C. Superior Court. Judge Nolan then joined the Public Defender Service for the District of Columbia where he spent 11 years doing trial work at all levels; from juvenile matters, to adult Felony I cases. During his tenure at the Public Defender Service, Judge Nolan also worked in the appellate division, served as a member of the hiring committee, forensic practice group, and was the chair of the Deborah T. Creek Criminal Practice Institute, which provided training to local criminal practitioners.
